1. Tuckett map of Nelson on floor in lower gallery

- Explain what the size and location of the native reserves tells us about the settlement of Nelson in 1842.
- List four ways that the map shows a colonial society and culture was establishing itself in Nelson.
- What assumptions may have been made by the New Zealand Company in the town planning of Nelson in the 1840s?

2. Chart Nelson Harbour 1901

Chart shows path that The Cut will take through the Boulder Bank to Nelson Harbour

- The Boulder Bank is a natural feature consisting of a boulder ridge sheltering the port of Nelson. What changes would The Cut make for Nelson shipping?
- Explain the type of unorganised migration that occurred in the South Island starting in the 1860s.
- How would the existence of The Cut affect the economy of Nelson?

3. Auckland Point, Nelson 1845 . Watercolour by Charles Heaphy

Charles Heaphy was an artist who worked for the New Zealand Company

- Identify a features of this painting that demonstrates interaction between Maori and European settlers.
- Identify two features of the painting that demonstrate successful settlement of Nelson.
- Explain why Charles Heaphy might have shown these features in his painting.

3. Hop picking in the Maitai 1867 Edwin Harris

- Give one piece of evidence of arable farming and one of pastoral farming shown in this painting.

- b) Hops are used to give beer its characteristic flavour. There was concern as early as the 1840s about excessive male drinking. This led to two major social movements. Name these movements.
- c) What was the impact of these movements by 1900?

4. Ngati Tama Tukutuku and text Karanga whanau

- a) Name the mountain portrayed in the tukutuku.
- b) Explain the significance of the arrows in the tukutuku
- c) What were the principles of the Te Atiawa chiefs of Parihaka in the 1870s.

5. Fortification of Church Hill following the Wairau Affray 1843

Arthur Wakefield was killed in this incident resulting from a disagreement over the purchase of land from Maori by the Wakefield company. The citizens of Nelson decided to fortify Church Hill.

- a) Identify two characteristics of early land deals that may have led to the Wairau Affray.
- b) Give two factors that may have contributed to the decision to fortify the hill.
- c) How are the actions of the New Zealand Company viewed today?
